Christian Marriage Life Coaching

Description:

Marriage is the building block and the stability of our society. This course will equip you as a marriage coach in the understanding of God's purpose for marriage. You will know your role as a marriage coach and how to help couples in strengthening their marriage by making God their foundation. As a coach, you will walk alongside the couples to help them identify the obstacles in their marriage relationship and how to overcome those obstacles in reverence and submission to one another. You will help the couples to get a deeper meaning of Marriage as a union between a man and a woman which involves leaving both parents and other distractions, cleaving together in oneness and becoming one flesh according to God's blue print for marriage in the scriptures. Through this course as a marriage coach, you will enhance your understanding of the needs of humans in the area of security and significance, which cannot be satisfied or fully given to us by any other human being but only by God. You will help couples to get over the cliché "once I get married I will be finally happy." Through this course, as a marriage coach you will be able to help the couples come to a deeper understanding of the union of marriage, giving them the most important roadmap to joy, happiness, peace and bliss in their home, which is the knowledge that only God can satisfy their deepest needs and give them eternal fulfillment.

- You will see the plan of God and His blueprint for marriage according to Gen.2
- You will get a deeper understanding of the wife's responsibilities in a marriage
- You will get a deeper understanding of the husband's responsibility in a marriage
- You will know the steps that husband and wife can take in a marriage when they are angry at each other.
- You will get an understanding of the twelve practical ways to develop and maintain good marital communication in a marriage.
- You will work towards maintaining peace in your home and how the different ways to predict a happy marriage.
- Your perception of marriage will change by overcoming the four myths of marriage.
- You will become a better husband/wife in your marriage by becoming aware of the unconscious roles that husbands and wives fall into in a marriage.

4. Completely and prayerfully read *Saving your marriage before it starts* by Les & Leslie Parrott. The SYMBIS assessment for couples is not a requirement for this course but it can be a good resource for you as part of your marriage coaching tools. Answer all For Reflection questions at the end of each chapter.
5. Completely and prayerfully read the *SoulTalk* by Larry Crabb. Write a minimum of 2-3 pages summary of what you learned from the teachings in the text. Complete all journaling for the text *Soul Talk* found under Application and journaling Questions in your student syllabus.
6. Final Paper: In a fictitious setting, write a report with a minimum of 2-3 pages. Choose any topic or topics from any of the textbooks and teachings from this course; coach a fictitious client of your choice on Christian. You can also use resources that you have

acquired in your coaching tool box i.e. assessment tests for couples, personality tests etc. Include the following in your coaching report:

- a. Your main topic you chose from the course, with your coaching title and the textbook/textbooks title.
 - b. Your client data/information form, including names(fictitious)
 - c. Your coaching agreement form
 - d. The reason why coaching is needed
 - e. Your coaching evaluation at the end of the coaching final session (Coaching contract can be set between 6-12 weeks, this is fictitious)
 - f. Your report will be submitted to your instructor in Lesson 12.
7. ** Earn at least a “B” on all your coursework exercises, Book report, Test and Final exam**.

Standards for Grading Assignments

As indicated below, “C” or 2.0 level work is considered average. **Leaders are not average people.** You are therefore expected (required) to put forth the effort necessary to demonstrate at least “B” (3.0) level work or higher on all assignments which you submit. Any which do not will be returned to you with input from your instructor on how you can raise your grade to the expected level. **A course grade will not be given until your assignments demonstrate that you have understood the material presented in the course and allowed your life to be transformed by the Spirit and the Word studied** — the requirements for attaining a “B”.

Your individual assignments (notebooks, tests, reports) will be graded according to the following standards. These grades will be averaged together to determine your course grade. Remember, we are training leaders and leaders are above-average people. Your work will reflect that.

- “D”
 - Indicates barely passing work that is inferior to the average both in quantity and in quality.
 - Manifests a lack of initiative or sense of responsibility or both.
- “C”
 - Average work; either steady work of an acceptable quality, or work of a high quality which is uneven, irregular or fragmentary.
 - May be mechanically or outwardly correct but shows little reflection upon or personal assimilation of the material.
- “B”
 - Intelligently has fulfilled the requirements of this course.
 - Understands the subject matter presented and has applied it to his life in a limited manner but has not really made the truths his own.
- “A”
 - Grasped the material with thoroughness, industry and correctness of detail.
 - Made the material his own by thinking about it and integrating it, using originality, natural ability, and insight.
