Secrets of Salvation

Description:

Jesus declared that He came to give us life abundantly (Jn. 10:10). The Greek word for "abundantly" means "over and above, more than is necessary, superadded, exceedingly, beyond measure, superior, surpassing, remarkable, uncommon, extraordinary." You know that Jesus has promised you a home in heaven when you die, but He has also promised that those who believe in Him *have* everlasting life – starting the moment that they believe. God wants to give you not only a glorious eternity with Him but an extraordinary life here on earth!

The center and foundation of this new life is the presence of the Holy Spirit within you, making you into a new creation with a divine nature that lives in dependence on and obedience to Him. This course will show you many of the incredible promises the Lord has made to His children, and will teach you how to rely on the Holy Spirit to accomplish all He wants to in you and through you. It doesn't matter if you are a brand new believer or if you have been following the Lord for many years – He always has more to show us and more exciting revelations to give to us.

- You will discuss how to put the deeds of the flesh to death by the power of the Spirit.
- You will discuss what does happen and what doesn't happen when you sin.
- You will discuss what to do if you sin.
- You will discuss the enemy's strategies against you and the weapons you have to overcome his attacks.
- You will discuss generational sins and curses and how they can be broken.
- You will discuss at least three possible sources of troubles and trials in your life, and how to respond.
- You will state and discuss the six reasons why the cross must be kept central in the life of the church and your personal life.

Attitudinal:

- You will better understand what it means to be a child of God.
- You will recognize the presence of the Holy Spirit within your innermost being.
- You will more fully embrace Jesus as your Lord and Master.
- You will recognize the new heart and spirit that you have been given.
- You will rejoice in God's commitment to your physical health, from Jehovah Rapha in the Old Testament to Jesus' carrying of our diseases to the Spirit giving life to our bodies.
- You will embrace God's promise to meet all your physical needs.
- You will cast all your cares on Him, knowing how much He cares for you.
- You will appreciate the Bible that God has given us as a light to our path with Him.
- You will understand that the blessings of the extraordinary life you have received come out of living in a daily relationship with your Father.
- You will embrace the goodness of God's laws.
- You will accept that being a Christian doesn't mean everything is perfect in your life.
- You will embrace your destiny of being conformed to the image of Christ.

Standards for Grading Assignments

As indicated below, "C" or 2.0 level work is considered average. Leaders are not average people. You are therefore expected (required) to put forth the effort necessary to demonstrate at least "B" (3.0) level work or higher on all assignments which you submit. Any which do not will be returned to you with input from your instructor on how you can raise your grade to the expected level. A course grade will not be given until your assignments demonstrate that you have understood the material presented in the course and allowed your life to be transformed by the Spirit and the Word studied — the requirements for attaining a "B".

Your individual assignments (notebooks, tests, reports) will be graded according to the following standards. These grades will be averaged together to determine your course grade. Remember, we are training leaders and leaders are above-average people. Your work will reflect that.

- "D" Indicates barely passing work that is inferior to the average both in quantity and in quality.
 - Manifests a lack of initiative or sense of responsibility or both.
 - Average work; either steady work of an acceptable quality, or work of a high quality which is uneven, irregular or fragmentary.
 - May be mechanically or outwardly correct but shows little reflection upon or personal assimilation of the material.
- "B" Intelligently has fulfilled the requirements of this course.
 - Understands the subject matter presented and has applied it to his life in a limited manner but has not really made the truths his own.
- 'A" Grasped the material with thoroughness, industry and correctness of detail.
 - Made the material his own by thinking about it and integrating it, using originality, natural ability, and insight.

Behavioral:

- You will always depend on the Holy Spirit to guide you every time you read the Bible.
- You will begin reading the Bible every day.
- You will find and begin using a plan to read through the whole Bible in a year.
- You will embrace the amazing promises to those who will meditate on God's words.
- You will have a plan for making biblical meditation part of your spiritual life.
- You will receive the gift of the baptism in the Holy Spirit with speaking in tongues.
- You will recall to your mind all that Jesus accomplished through His death and resurrection, and by the demonstration of your life, proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.
- You will make two-way conversations with the Lord a regular part of your daily life.
- You will stop trying to be a good person by the strength of your own will and instead immediately turn to the Spirit within you to empower you to resist any temptation you face.
- You will begin to take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ.
- You will begin to walk in perfect peace because your imagination is stayed on the Lord.
- You will be a living demonstration of God's love and power in your world.
- You will face each day with excitement, knowing that it's going to be extraordinary!
