LEA105 Unique Gifts Make Winning Teams

3 credits

Description

God has a specific call on your life and has given you unique gifts to help you fulfill that call. But He never planned for you to succeed on your own. You have incredible gifts that are necessary to the world and to the Body of Christ, but you are only one member of that Body. God intends for you to work together with others whose gifts are different from yours to accomplish even greater things. Only when each individual is working properly himself, and also is appropriately fitted and held together with every other part, will the Body grow up in all aspects into Him who is the Head (Eph. 4:15,16).

That is the purpose of this course: to help you discover your unique gifts, as well as your level of maturity and preparedness for various types of work and ministry. But we will take it a major step further, helping you see your areas of weakness and guiding you in joining together with others whose gifts are very different from yours. You will begin to develop teams to work together in every area of your life, recognizing and honoring the strengths of others that fill in the gaps of your own weaknesses. As a result, you will experience victory and success like you could never achieve on your own.

Course Objectives

As a result of the course, you will:

- You will quote each of the following Scripture passages in the designated versions:

- You will seek the Lord for a better understanding of yourself and the unique way the Lord has created you so that you are prepared to be used in every way He calls you.
- You will follow the Lord's leading to serve God and mankind with the passion, skills, and character traits that God has placed within you.
- You will state the following for each of the five-fold giftings:
 - ✓ the underlying heart motivation
 - \checkmark at least one person who is identified as such in the New Testament
 - ✓ its major responsibility or primary ministry
 - \checkmark how it may be expressed outside the traditional church structure

- You will discuss the differences between Old and New Testament prophets.
- You will state and avoid at least five abuses of heart motivations.
- You will embrace God's plan for you to be part of a team, no matter how difficult it may be.
- You will recognize and reject all attempts at domination or control.
- You will discuss and embrace the value of consensus decision-making for your team.
- You will seek to improve your communication skills in every setting.
- You will contrast the attributes of three kinds of negotiators: soft, hard, and principled.
- You will purpose in your spirit to always be a principled negotiator.
- You will discuss and practice the Scriptural approach to handling confrontation.
- You will evaluate your staff communication patterns.
- You will state and use the rules of brainstorming to stimulate your creative flow.
- You will name and define five styles of church leadership, and state
 what you see to be the greatest strength and greatest weakness of
 each.
- You will rejoice in the knowledge that God has gifted, called and anointed you to succeed in the destiny and individual assignments He has for you.

Course Requirements

- 1. Listen to or watch all teaching sessions as assigned. Taking notes in the related workbooks would be helpful to you.
- Prayerfully complete the entire *Gifted to Succeed* workbook as assigned. Answer all questionnaires, tests, profiles, questions and applications. Questionnaires, tests and profiles DO NOT need to be submitted to your instructor. Application and Journaling answers DO need to be submitted according to your instructor's directions.
- 3. Prayerfully read and meditate on the entire *How to Build a Winning Team* workbook, answering the related questions here in your syllabus and completing the exercises at the end of each chapter as appropriate for your current situation. These answers ARE TO BE SUBMITTED according to your instructor's directions.
- 4. Earn at least a "B" on Test One and the Final Test.
- 5. Write a Paper that includes the following:
 - a. What you have learned about yourself, the gifting of God within you, and the call of God upon you as a result of this course so far. What is your heart motivation mix? What is your strongest motivation? Are you more left- or right-brain? Are you more introvert or extrovert? How available are you for ministry at this time in your life? What does your DiSC profile show about you?
 - b. What are your areas of weakness? What kind of people do you especially need to seek out to help you be most effective?
 - c. Of all the possible jobs, vocations, and ministries listed in Gifted to Succeed for which you may be qualified, which ones sound most exciting to you? Is there one in particular that you feel the Lord is calling you to prepare for at this time in your life? If so, what are some of the ways in which you may gain

preliminary experience in this area through study, practica, or internships?

This paper will be a minimum of five pages and is due in Lesson Nine.

- 6. Write a second Paper that includes the following:
 - a. The first name and gift descriptions of the people on your "Leadership Team" in the most important area of your life right now (your church, business, home, volunteer organization, etc.).
 - b. Any areas of weakness you still see in your team and your journaling which indicates the Lord's direction to you for shoring up these weaknesses.
 - c. A description of how each of the individuals and gifts contributed and were honored in a recent decision-making situation.
 - d. Any steps your team has taken to improve its corporate communication skills and any improvements you have been able to observe as a result.

This paper will be a minimum of four pages and is due in the final lesson.

Standards for Grading Assignments

As indicated below, "C" or 2.0 level work is considered average. Leaders are not average people. You are therefore expected (required) to put forth the effort necessary to demonstrate at least "B" (3.0) level work or higher on all assignments which you submit. Any which do not will be returned to you with input from your instructor on how you can raise your grade to the expected level. A course grade will not be given until your assignments demonstrate that you have understood the material presented in the course and allowed your life to be transformed by the Spirit and the Word studied — the requirements for attaining a "B".

Your individual assignments (notebooks, tests, reports) will be graded according to the following standards. These grades will be averaged together to determine your course grade. Remember, we are training leaders and leaders are above-average people. Your work will reflect that.

- "D" Indicates barely passing work that is inferior to the average both in quantity and in quality.
 - Manifests a lack of initiative or sense of responsibility or both.
- "C" Average work; either steady work of an acceptable quality, or work of a high quality which is uneven, irregular or fragmentary.
 - May be mechanically or outwardly correct but shows little reflection upon or personal assimilation of the material.
- "B" Intelligently has fulfilled the requirements of this course.
 - Understands the subject matter presented and has applied it to his life in a limited manner but has not really made the truths his own.
- "A" Grasped the material with thoroughness, industry and correctness of detail.
 - Made the material his own by thinking about it and integrating it, using originality, natural ability, and insight.
