- You will state and discuss at least 10 ways the Bible indicates that angels may minister to us.
- You will discuss what the Bible reveals about the way that God regards man.
- You will discuss the biblical warning about worshipping angels.
- You will state the basic beliefs of Gnosticism as they relate to angels.
- You will state and use the four keys for hearing and seeing Jesus and the company of Heaven.

- You will state and use five safeguards that will protect you as you explore the sacred supernatural.
- You will discuss the biblical precedents for asking the Lord to open the eyes of your heart to see the spiritual realm.
- You will discuss the nature and immediacy of the Kingdom of Heaven, and the significance of that.
- You will discuss what is promised and received in the baptism in the Holy Spirit, using Jesus as your example.
- You will discuss the place of your godly imagination in your spiritual life.
- You will state and use the most important key to seeing in the spirit.
- You will state at least 10 things you can do to help you move into a state that is more receptive to receiving from the spiritual realm.
- You will discuss how you can commission angels.
- You will discuss the relationship of time with the Kingdom of Heaven and how that can influence the way we live.
- You will discuss the significance of the *kenosis* passage in Philippians 2:6-8.
- You will discuss the role of angels in the harvesting of souls.
- You will ask Jesus to introduce you to your guardian angels.

Standards for Grading Assignments

As indicated below, “C” or 2.0 level work is considered average. **Leaders are not average people.** You are therefore expected (required) to put forth the effort necessary to demonstrate at least “B” (3.0) level work or higher on all assignments which you submit. Any which do not will be returned to you with input from your instructor on how you can raise your grade to the expected level. **A course grade will not be given until your assignments demonstrate that you have understood the material presented in the course and allowed your life to be transformed by the Spirit and the Word studied** — the requirements for attaining a “B”.

Your individual assignments (notebooks, tests, reports) will be graded according to the following standards. These grades will be averaged together to determine your course grade. Remember, we are training leaders and leaders are above-average people. Your work will reflect that.

- “D”
 - Indicates barely passing work that is inferior to the average both in quantity and in quality.
 - Manifests a lack of initiative or sense of responsibility or both.
- “C”
 - Average work; either steady work of an acceptable quality, or work of a high quality which is uneven, irregular or fragmentary.
 - May be mechanically or outwardly correct but shows little reflection upon or personal assimilation of the material.
- “B”
 - Intelligently has fulfilled the requirements of this course.
 - Understands the subject matter presented and has applied it to his life in a limited manner but has not really made the truths his own.
- “A”
 - Grasped the material with thoroughness, industry and correctness of detail.
 - Made the material his own by thinking about it and integrating it, using originality, natural ability, and insight.

Course Requirements:

NOTE: You will be turning in your exercises, papers and test to your instructor so write them in a manner that will facilitate this. Their preferred way to receive coursework is as email attachment. If you send hard copies to your instructor, there is a chance they will be lost in the mail. Do not send your only copy of your work.

- 1) Prayerfully read the text *Everyday Angels* as assigned and listen to or watch all video sessions as assigned.
- 2) Answer all the related questions found here in your Student Notebook as well as all of the “What about you?” questions at the end of each chapter.
- 3) Prayerfully read *Angels in our Lives* as assigned, answering all the related questions found here in your Student Notebook.
- 4) Prayerfully read *Eyes that See* as assigned, answering the related questions found here in your Student Notebook.
- 5) Earn at least a “B” on the Final Test.
- 6) Submit a two-part Final Paper.
 - a) Part 1 – Explain your current understanding of angels, particularly guardian or personal angels, in the Kingdom and in the life of the believer. Support your positions with plenty of Scripture.
 - b) Part 2 – Describe your experience with the angelic realm since beginning this course.
